## Cartersville Has Population of 4,227

A census authorized by the city council has just been completed in Cartersville, and a careful count made by three of the prominent citizens who were detailed to take the census shows a gain of 200 souls over the figures made by the government enumerators. The count made by the citizens includes school figures also, which are given in detail below. Regular census taken by U. S. government gives Cartersville a population of 4,067. The special census just taken gives the city 4,227, which is an increase over the government figures of 160. The population is divided into wards as follows:

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stance "that was a matter for the teachers and principals to handle", the same not being in the best interests of the school system and the pupils enrolled in the school system. There were 144 failures in the elementary schools and approximately 83 failures in the high school for the past school year.

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He failed to familiarize himself with the terms and conditions of the contract between the Cartersville Board of Education and the Bartow County Board of Education with respect to the joint operation of the negro high school, and failed to prepare separate figures for the cost of maintenance and operation of this high school or to request the said Board of Education to assist him in such preparation, so as to present an approved budget for the operation of this joint high school to the County Board of Education for their approval, and in order to avail the City Board of Education of the prorata share of such expenses to be paid under said contract by the County Board.

He failed to acquaint the Board with the true status of the qualifications of the visiting teacher employed in the school system, and as to the amount of her salary which was paid by the State of Georgia.

He established a trend toward lowering our high school standards in the elimination of algebra as a required unit in the general course to be offered in the 1955-1956 curriculum; and in establishing a curriculum for said year requiring only one unit of science in the general course, the same not being in the best interests of the school system or of the pupils enrolled therein.

The Board of Education of the City of Cartersville, Ga., met in regular session at City Hall at 7.30 P.M. Dec 13-26

Present: O.W.Haney, W.B.Perry, Ben C.Gilreath, H.B.Rebertsen.

On motion and second it was it was decided to open the Spring Term Monday, Jan. 3rd.

On motion and second it was carried that the Board of Education recommend that the City of Cartersville build shop for negroes according to specifications submitted by Walter B.Hill, who proposes to pay \$600, of the cost of same, and also J.S.Morgan proposes to raise and pay \$150. of the cost of same.

Moved and seconded and carried that High School Students be required to pay a Library fee of one dollar (\$1. ) per year. ~~Five dollars (\$5.00) payable in~~ Fifty cents (.50c) payable ~~in~~ September and fifty cents (.50c ) payable January. Said fee to be collected as part of regular tuition for these two months.

TEACHER'S CONTRACT

For Teachers of Vocational Agriculture  
Employed in co-operation with Georgia State Board For  
Vocational Education

This is to certify that the Board of Education of Cartersville, Ga.  
has entered into a contract with J.S. Morgan to teach  
Vocational Agriculture in the Cartersville (colored) school.  
The salary of said J.S. Morgan to be 990 per  
month from Sept. 1, 1925 to Sept. 1, 1926, and is to be paid  
monthly by the said board as follows: 990 cash,  
and no perquisite.

The said teacher of Vocational Agriculture shall give part of  
his time to the teaching of agriculture according to the plan  
set forth by the Georgia State Board for Vocational Education, and  
he shall supervise the practical work of the pupils whom he is  
instructing. In addition to the regular teaching set forth above  
the teacher shall be expected to be Principal of school and teach  
literary work about half of his time.
