Held at the Cartersville School Board, Cartersville, GA

Cartersville Ga., 3/6 1903.

The Board met at the usual time and place. There were present Messrs Akin, Collins, Ford, Lewis and Strickland.

Minutes of preceding meeting were read and approved.

The report of the Supt. was read; and his recommendation that this Board formally approve our High Schools taking part in the Declamation Contest to be held in Atlanta on the first Saturday in May was adopted.

The Chairman of Finance Committee reported bills approved, as follows:

Pay Roll of White Schools	\$419.49

The Chairman of Buildings Committee reported enough on hand for the remainder of this session.

The President announced that he had appointed Mr. Knight to serve instead of Mr. Aherman on the committees to which Mr. Aherman had been formally appointed.

On motion, the Secy was instructed to purchase a new minute book.

On motion it was ordered that the negro school be re-opened March 16th unless in the mean time new cases of small pox should break out among the negro school children or their immediate families.

It was moved that the Supt. be instructed to supply vacancy in the principalship of negro school at a salary not to exceed \$25 per month. The motion prevailed.

There being no further business on hand the Board adjourned.

• Adjourned meeting of the School Board, held June 13, 1904.

President John W. Akin presiding.

On motion of Mr. Albert Strickland, the election for secretary was held and W. Akerman was declared elected.

Annual report of the Superintendent was read by him and received by the board.

The Board then went into the election of teachers. Motion was made by Mr. Lewis to postpone the election of teachers for two weeks. On motion being put by the President four voted for the motion and four against the motion, and the motion was declared lost by the president.

The Board went in to the election of Superintendent and W. W. Daves was declared elected.

On motion of Mr. Akerman the board decided to elect the white teachers, both in the high school and the grammar school by grade with the following results :
Second Grade High School Miss Lena Ford ;
First grade High School Miss Viola Standiford ; Sixth grade Grammar School Miss Sallie M. Akin ; Fifth grade Grammar School Miss Julia Foute ; Third and Fourth Grades Grammar School West side, Mrs. Oament ; First and Second grade Grammar School West side, Miss Eva Happoldt ; Third and Fourth Grade East School Miss Laura Graham; First and Second Grade East School Miss Goodwin, as principal.

Colored School G. D. Carnes, principal, and the following teachers ; Addie Allen, Texas Emanuel and Leah Smith. Superintendent Daves was instructed to place the three ^{colored} school teachers.

On motion of Mr. Akerman the salaries of the grammar school teachers of the six grades of the white school was raised from Thirty Five to Forty Dollars per month. The Board then adjourned.

School board met in pursuance of a call by President Akin. Hon John W. Akin presiding. Absent Mr Strickland & Laramore. Minutes of last meeting read & approved. Supt. Report read & received. Resignation of Miss Baker read & accepted. Resignation of G.D. Carnes as prin of Colored School was read & accepted. Resignation of W.W. Daves as Supt. read & accepted. On motion of Mr Lewis Miss Stanford was changed to second high school grade & Miss Mary Dwelle was elected to the first high school grade. W.H. Harper was then elected to the principalship of the Colored school. On motion of Mr Akin a resolution expressing confidence & satisfaction in the manner in which Prof. Daves had managed the affairs of the schools was adopted by rising vote. On motion of Mr Crouch Judge Akin was requested to draw suitable resolutions of confidence in Prof. Daves to be spread on our minutes

The regular pay roll for teachers for Dec was ordered payed also bill for \$20.60 for supplies at the Book store. Bill of Gaines Marble Co for \$2.25 for putting in steps at west school was ordered paid & sec. was instructed to present same to the city council with the request that as they had done grading that caused the necessity of doing this work that they reimburse this board for the expense of same.

Meeting then adjourned.

City School Board met in regular session Hon Jon.W.Akin presiding . All members present. Minutes last meeting read and approved. Report of finance committee showing an itemized report of the expenditures of the public schools for the schoolastic year ended May 31 was read and approved. The following bills were ordered paid . Doc Wofferd \$1.00 Dennis Shell \$.70 W.Akerman \$.90 Cartersville Printing Co, \$4.00 J.E.Wikle \$10.00 . Committee was then appointed composed of T.C.Milner , A.Strickland , W.P.Laramore for the purpose of meeting the city council and taking up the question insprence and repairs on the schoolbuildings and determining who should pay for such items . The board then went into the election of officers for the ensuing year with the following result President John.W.Akin~~\$\$\$~~ Vice President A.Strickland. Sec. W.Akerman. Prof Sewell was then elected Superentendent for the ensuing year . Carreis and .W.H.Harper was elected . It was then move that the board elcet the Col . Teachers all atonce and that the Supt .requested to please them in their repsective grades subject to the approval of the board . The election was then held and the following were elected , Addie Allen, Lizzie Harper , Annes Copeland . A discussion then arose as to whether there should be eight or nine regular grades in the ~~school~~ white school , T.C.miner then made the following Motion That there be nine grades in the white school and that all the grammar school teachers be paid a salary of \$40. per month . ~~His~~ motion carried . Mr Brown then moved to reconsider Mr Milners motion and after some discussion Judge Akin offered the following as a substitute for the whole. That of the nine teachers already elected one to be a supernumerary selected by the Supt. and the other eight be placed in the existing grades as the Supt may select subject to the approval of the board, the salary of the supernumerary to be \$35. permonth and salaries of the others to remain as now fixed . Board then adjourned

TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

We your committee on buildings beg leave to report the following .
We have purchased 50 new desks for the new room in the West school and
also composition blackboards for same and have fitted up room as per
your instructions . We have also ordered a steel awning for the back door
of the school at west building as it is now necessary for the children
in the primary grades to march in at this door and necessitates a covering
of some kind . We also found that desks in the colored school were worn out
and we took some of the old desks that were left over from the high school
and fitted up one room and had a carpenter to repair and fit up a some pine
desks which we think will do for the present . We recommend that the children
be encouraged to observe arbour day and plant some trees at various places
on the grounds of all the schools in such places as the board and Supt may
select and that expense of digging up the trees and carrying same to the
school grounds be payed by the board.

The enrollment in the white schools is 25 greater than that of last year, and that of the colored school is greater by 4 than that of last year.

The school census taken last year gives Carterville a total school popu-

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lation of 1042 children between the ages of six and eighteen. Of these 627 are white and 415 are colored. There are about 90 per cent. of the white children attended school this year, and about 73 per cent. of the colored children.

Attendance.

The per cent. of attendance for the year in the white schools, has been 94.3 per cent., and in the colored school 85.5 per cent.

Good work is being done in all the grades. The teachers are all conscientious in the discharge of their duties, and have been very enthusiastic about their school work.

I recommend that the walls of the West School Building be calcimined during the vacation. They are in a very bad condition. I recommend also that you put recitation benches in the two class-rooms of the High School. These old benches are giving away and are very uncomfortable for the pupils.
